The Prescott Community Cupboard Food Bank (PCCFB) story began in 1973 with 7 founding churches. With the help of our generous donors, dedicated volunteers, and compassionate staff, PCCFB has been providing groceries to empower households in Yavapai County, feeding the hungry in Yavapai County for decades. The Prescott Cupboard joined forces with Prescott Valley in 2024 and is now recognized as The Community Cupboard.

Our achievements

Last year, we distributed **1,015,929** pounds of food to an average of **1,200** average clients per week, ensuring no one in our community went to bed hungry. *NOTE The pounds of food distributed includes food bags with approximately 12.5 lbs. per bag, PLUS other items from our “Choice Pantry” fresh produce, dairy, bread, bakery items, prepared foods, kitchen essentials, household items, personal care items, infant supplies, and much more.

Thanks to our supporters, we distributed **37,600** bags of food which provided **4,703** households, and **9,265** individuals with weekly access to nutritious meals.

We had a **43%** increase of in the number of registrations for our services compared to 2024. The needs of our communities continue to increase every year.

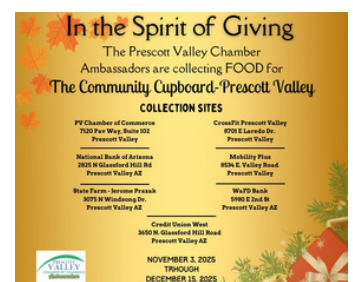
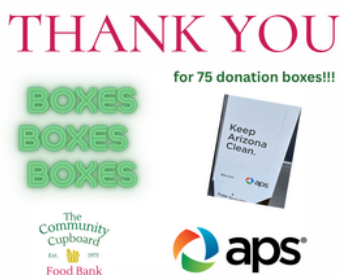
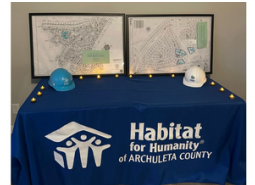
