# Message from the Chairperson

*Board Chairperson, Bud Heitman, reported a progressively successful year in 2024, achieving goals and meeting the rising numbers of food insecure residents in Yavapai County.*

Wow! – 2024 was a big year for the Prescott Community Cupboard Food Bank. The beginning of 2024 our mobile food bank was just an idea. Since then we purchased a refrigerated truck with the help of generous grants. We started out with 1 location serving 5 clients and have grown into 5 location serving over 900 clients a week all within food deserts with more locations on the horizon. In August the Prescott Valley Food Bank merged into PCCFB forming a strong relationship to provide food to those suffering food insecurity in Yavapai County.

The purchase of the Prescott Valley food Bank building came in September with plans to triple the Prescott Valley Food Bank footprint by June 2025. I am humbled to be able to work along side of our amazing volunteers, employees and board to fulfill our mission to serve those experiencing food insecurity in the surrounding areas. # Our story so far

## About Prescott Community Cupboard Food Bank, Inc.

The Prescott Community Cupboard Food Bank (PCCFB) story began in 1973 with 7 founding churches. With the help of our generous donors, dedicated volunteers, and compassionate staff, PCCFB has been providing groceries to empower households in Yavapai County, feeding the hungry in Yavapai County for decades.

## Our Mission

PCCFB's mission is to serve individuals and families who are experiencing food insecurity in Yavapai County.



## Our Vision

The PCCFB recognizes the innate worth of every human being and accepts people as they are and seeks to assist them in receiving the necessary food to support their daily nutritional needs as part of an active, healthy, lifestyle.

# Our achievements

Last year, we distributed 590,460 pounds of food to an average of 865 clients per week, ensuring no one in our community went to bed hungry. \*NOTE The pounds of food distributed includes food bags with approximately 12.5 lbs. per bag, PLUS other items from our “Choice Pantry” fresh produce, dairy, bread, bakery items, prepared foods, kitchen essentials, household items, personal care items, infant supplies, and much more.

Thanks to our supporters, we distributed 20,434 bags of food, which provided over 245,208 meals, and equipped 422 households with weekly access to nutritious meals.

40% of the food we distributed last year was fresh produce, contributing to healthier diets for our community members.

We served nearly 9% of those estimated food insecure individuals, reducing Yavapai County’s hunger gap.

## Main sources of revenue


